#### KNITS

All aboard! You'll be right on track with this adorable toddler ensemble. Choo! Choo!

#### FOR KIDS

#### **Experience Level**

Intermediate\*\*\*

#### Size

Pullover in children's size 4(6)(8)(10) Hat in sizes 4–6(8–10) Instructions are given for the smallest size, with larger sizes in parentheses. When only 1 number is given, it applies to all sizes.

#### Finished Measurements

Hat: To fit a head measurement of 19(20)"


Chest: 25(27)(29)(31)"

Armhole depth:  $5\frac{1}{2}(6)(6\frac{1}{2})(7)$ " Side to underarm: 8(9)(10)(11)" Sleeve:  $10\frac{1}{2}(11\frac{1}{2})(12\frac{1}{2})(14)$ "

#### Materials

- Worsted weight 100 percent wool crepe yarn\* (435 yds/200 grams per skein): 2(2)(2)(3) skeins magnolia #013 (MC); 1 (50-gram) ball each crimson #093, gold #054, royal #048, bottle #028, black #021
- Size 4 straight and 16" circular needles
- Size 6 needles or size needed to obtain gauge
- Stitch holders
- 4" piece of cardboard
- Cable needle

#### Gauge

20 sts and 25 rows = 4"/10cm in St st with larger ndls

To save time, take time to check gauge.

#### **Special Abbreviation**

**P2tog-b:** Purl 2 stitches together through the back loops.

#### **Pattern Notes**

Wind separate balls or bobbins of each color for each train car. To avoid holes, always pick up new color from under old.

Body is CO and worked in 1 piece to underarm, then divided for front and back yokes.

#### Pattern Stitches

Left Raglan Cable

Rows 1, 3 & 5 (WS): K1, p4, k1.

**Row 2:** P1, sl 2 sts to cn and hold in front, k2, k2 from cn, p2tog.

Rows 4 & 6: P1, k4, p2tog.

Right Raglan Cable

Rows 1, 3 & 5 (WS): K1, p4, k1.

**Row 2:** P2tog-b, sl 2 sts to cn and hold in back, k2, k2 from cn, p1.

Rows 4 & 6: P2tog-b, k4, p1.

#### Hat

With smaller ndls and MC, CO 85(90) sts. Work even in k1, p1, rib for  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ", changing to larger ndls and inc 10 sts evenly on last row. (95, 100 sts)

Work even in St st for  $\frac{3}{4}(1)$ ", end with RS row. P 1 row black.

#### **Set Up Patt**

**Size 4–6:** Work Row 1 of charts for F, B in gold, A, C using gold, E, k10 MC.

**Size 8–10:** Work Row 1 of charts F, B using gold, B using bottle, A, C, E, k2 MC.

Work even in est patts until hat meas 7(8)" from beg, end with a WS row.

#### Dec for Top

**Row 1:** \*K1, k2tog, rep from \* across. Work 3 rows even. Rep these 4 rows. Rep Row 1. P 1 row.

**Next Row:** K2tog across row.

Cut yarn, leaving an 18" end; run yarn through rem sts. Sew seam.

#### Tassel

Cut a 6" strand of MC and set aside. Holding all colors except black tog, wrap yarn around cardboard 25 times. Tie at 1 end with reserved 6" strand. Cut opposite end. Trim ends even. Tie tassel securely to top of hat. Shake vigorously to fluff.

#### **Pullover**

#### **Body**

With MC and smaller ndls, CO 107(115) (123)(131) sts. Work even in k1, p1 rib for  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ", changing to larger ndls and inc 19(21)(23)(25) sts evenly on last row. (126, 136, 146, 156 sts)

Work even in St st for  $\frac{3}{4}(1)$ ", ending with a RS row. P 1 row black.

#### Set up patt

Referring to chosen size, work Row 1 of each chart.

**Size 4:** Charts F, B using bottle, B using gold, A, C, D, E, k12 MC.


**Size 6(8):** Charts F, B using bottle, B using gold, A, C, A, D, E, k7(17) MC.

**Size 10:** Charts F, B using bottle, B using gold, A, C, A, C, D, E, k16 MC.

Work even in est patts until sweater meas 8(9)(10)(11)" or desired length from beg, ending with a WS row.

#### Back raglan shaping

BO 2(3)(4)(5) sts at beg of next row, k59 (62)(65)(68), sl rem sts to holder. Work Row 1 of Left Raglan Cable patt, St st to



last 6 sts, work Row 1 of Right Cable patt. Work in est patts until 21(22)(25)(26) sts rem. BO all sts.


#### Front raglan shaping

SI sts from holder to larger ndls. With RS facing, join MC at left underarm. BO 4(6)(8)(10) sts, k to end of row. BO 2(3) (4)(5) sts at beg of next row. Work raglan shapings as for back until 27(28)(31)(32) sts rem.

#### Shape front neck

Without dec, work Left Raglan Cable over 6 sts, sl next 15(16)(19)(20) sts to holder, join 2nd ball of yarn and work Right Raglan Cable over last 6 sts. Working on both sides

of neck with separate balls of yarn and eliminating cable crossing, [dec 1 st at each neck edge every row] 6 times. Fasten off rem st.

#### Sleeves


With MC and smaller ndls, CO 29(29)(33) (35) sts. Work even in k1, p1 rib for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ )(2)(2)", changing to larger ndls and inc 5(7)(9)(9) sts evenly on last row. (34, 36, 42, 44 sts)

Working in St st, [inc 1 st each end of ndl every 4th(4th)(6th)(6th) row] 10(12) (11)(12) times. (54, 60, 64, 68 sts)

Work even until sleeve meas  $10\frac{1}{2}(11\frac{1}{2})$  ( $12\frac{1}{2})(14)$ " or desired length from beg, ending with a WS row.

### **Shape underarm & raglan top** BO 2(3)(4)(5) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Work raglan shaping as for back until 12(14)(16)(16) sts rem. BO all sts.

Sew raglan seams, underarm and right side seam. Embroider number 9 on side of engine.



#### **Neck Band**

Beg at back right shoulder with smaller 16" circ ndls and MC, pick up and knit 21(22) (25)(26) sts along back of neck, 12(14)(16) (16) sts at left shoulder, 29(30)(33)(34) sts at front, and 12(14)(16)(16) sts at right shoulder. (74, 80, 90, 92 sts)

Join, placing a marker between first and last st. Work in k1, p1 ribbing for 1". BO loosely. ❖
