Materials

■ Worsted yarn:

40 oz. winter white 20 oz. each red and green

□ Tapestry needle

☐ H and J hooks or hook needed to obtain gauge

Finished Size: $60^{\circ} \times 62^{\circ}$.

Gauge: H hook, 9 sc = 3"; 9 sc rows =

3". Each Motif is $7\frac{3}{4}$ " × $7\frac{1}{2}$ ". **Basic Stitches:** Ch, sl st, sc.

Afghan

Motif (make 32 white/red; 32 white/green)

Note: When changing colors (see Stitch Guide), always change color in last st made, drop unused color to wrong side of work, pick up when needed.

Row 1: With H hook and white, ch 24, sc in second ch from hook, sc in next 21 chs changing to next color (see Note), sc in last ch, turn. (23 sc made)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts changing to white, sc in last 21 sts, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first 20 sts changing to next color, sc in last 3 sts, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sts changing to white, sc in last 19 sts, turn.


Row 5: Ch 1,sc in first 18 sts changing to next color, sc in last 5 sts, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sts changing to white, sc in last 17 sts, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1,sc in first 16 sts changing to next color,sc in last 7 sts, turn.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in first 8 sts changing to white, sc in last 15 sts, turn.Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first 14 sts changing

to next color, sc in last 9 sts, turn.

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in first 10 sts changing to white, sc in last 13 sts, turn.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in first 12 sts changing to next color, sc in last 11 sts, turn.

Row 12: Ch 1, sc in first 12 sts changing to white, sc in last 11 sts, turn.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in first 10 sts changing to next color, sc in last 13 sts, turn.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in first 14 sts changing to white, sc in last 9 sts, turn.

Row 15: Ch 1, sc in first 8 sts changing to next color, sc in last 15 sts, turn.

Row 16: Ch 1, sc in first 16 sts changing to white, sc in last 7 sts, turn.

Row 17: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sts changing to next color, sc in last 17 sts, turn.

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in first 18 sts changing to white, sc in last 5 sts, turn.

Row 19: Ch 1, sc in first 4 sts changing to next color, sc in last 19 sts, turn.

Row 20: Ch 1, sc in first 20 sts changing to white, sc in each of last 3 sts, turn.

Row 21: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts changing to next color, sc in last 21 sts, turn.

Row 22: Ch 1, sc in first 22 sts changing to white, sc in last st. Fasten off both colors.


Assembly

Arrange Motifs according to assembly illustration; matching stitches to stitches and rows to rows, with tapestry needle and matching colors, sew Motifs together.

Edging

Working around outer edge, with J hook and one strand each of red and green held together as one, join with sc in any st at corner, 2 sc in same st, sc in each st, in end of each row and in each remaining Ip on opposite side of starting ch around with 3 sc in each corner, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off. □□
